Are you fluent in more than one language and passionate about breaking down language barriers? Join us as a Volunteer Interpreter/Translator and help create spaces of solidarity where everyone can connect, share, and feel heard.

In this role, you'll support our workshops, events, and community gatherings. You may also assist with small translations, such as emails, WhatsApp group messages, and announcements, or provide proofreading support—all on an adhoc basis. For those with professional qualifications, there may be occasional opportunities for paid work.

Key Responsibilities

- **Event and Workshop Support:**
 - Provide interpretation at events, workshops, and community gatherings to ensure everyone can participate fully.
- **Translation:**
 - Help with translating short documents, emails, and announcements into community languages.
- **Proofreading:**
 - Assist with reviewing translated materials to ensure accuracy and clarity.

What We're Looking For

Essential:

- Fluency in English and at least one other language, with strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Flexibility to assist with tasks on an adhoc basis.
- Understanding of intersectional, anti-oppressive, anti-racist and trauma-informed approaches.

- Be committed to supporting the rights of all migrants, irrespective of nationality, immigration status, or other matters, and a commitment to advancing the rights of migrants.

Desirable:

- Experience in interpretation or translation.
- Familiarity with the migrant justice landscape in the UK, including awareness of support networks and signposting pathways.
- Ability to work collaboratively in diverse spaces like community gatherings and events.
